Keynote Speakers

Haruhiko Kuroda

Former Governor of the Bank of Japan, Vice-Minister of Finance for international Affairs, the President of the Asian Development Bank



Kuroda Haruhiko served as the 31st Governor of the Bank of Japan from March 2013 to April 2023. He held various positions at the Ministry of Finance, culminating in his role as Vice Minister of Finance for International Affairs from 1999 to 2003. Following this, he served as Special Advisor to the Cabinet of Prime Minister Koizumi while also teaching economics and finance as a Professor at the Hitotsubashi University Graduate School of Economics. He was appointed President of the Asian Development Bank from February 1, 2005, to March 18, 2013. Currently, he holds a position at the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS) as a Professor and Senior Fellow of the GRIPS Alliance.

Albert Park

Chief Economist at the Asian Development Bank



Albert F. Park is Chief Economist of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Director General of its Economic Research and Development Impact Department. He is chief spokesperson on economic and development trends and leads the production of ADB's flagship knowledge products and support for regional cooperation fora. Mr. Park has more than 2 decades of experience as a development economist and is a well-known expert on the economy of the People's Republic of China. He has worked on a broad range of development issues including poverty and inequality, intergenerational mobility, microfinance, migration and labor markets, the future of work, and foreign investment. Mr. Park is Chair Professor of Economics, Social Science, and Public Policy at HKUST (on leave). He served as a founding director of HKUST's Institute for Emerging Market Studies and Center for Economic Policy, and previously held faculty positions at the University of Oxford and University of Michigan. A national of the United States, he received his bachelor's degree in economics from Harvard University and his doctorate in applied economics from Stanford University.

Fukunari Kimura
President, IDE-JETRO



Fukunari Kimura has been a Professor at the Faculty of Economics, Keio University, Tokyo, Japan, since 2000 and became the President of IDE-JETRO in April 2024. Before this role, he served as Chief Economist at the Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) in Jakarta, Indonesia, from 2008 to 2024. He has also been a director of the East Asian Economic Association (EAEA) since 2014. His expertise lies in international trade and development economics. Fukunari received his Bachelor of Laws from the Faculty of Law at the University of Tokyo in 1982, and his M.S. and Ph.D. from the Department of Economics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1990 and 1991, respectively. He worked as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics at the State University of New York at Albany from 1991 to 1994, and then as an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Economics, Keio University, from 1994 to 2000. Fukunari has held several leadership roles, including President of the Japan Society of International Economics from 2010 to 2012, Representative Director of the Tokyo Center for Economic Research from 2012 to 2014, and Dean of the Graduate School of Economics at Keio University from 2015 to 2017. He is active in academic and semi-academic writing on topics such as production networks, economic integration, and the digital economy in East Asia.

Veerathai Santiprabhob
Former Governor, the Bank of Thailand



Veerathai Santiprabhob served as the 20th Governor of the Bank of Thailand from October 2015 to September 2020. He is a macroeconomist and financial professional with over 25 years of experience in economic policy design, commercial banking, and capital markets. Before his role as Governor, Veerathai was a member of the Bank of Thailand's Board and Monetary Policy Committee, as well as an advisor to the Thailand Development Research Institute. His private sector experience includes senior executive positions at the Stock Exchange of Thailand and Siam Commercial Bank. He has also held various board positions in leading corporations, including PTT Exploration and Production Public Company Limited (PTTEP), Mae Fah Luang Foundation under Royal Patronage, Siam Piwat Company Limited, the Independent Oversight Advisory Committee, World Food Programme, Thanachart Capital, Bangkok Dusit Medical Services, Thai Airways International, and Central Pattana. Veerathai earned a Ph.D. and MA. in Economics from Harvard University, along with a B.A. in Economics (First Class Honors) from Thammasat University.

Arsenio Balisacan

Secretary of the Philippine National Economic Development Authority



Dr. Arsenio Balisacan is Secretary of the Philippine National Economic Development Authority. Secretary Balisacan previously served as the Chairperson and Chief Executive of the Philippine Competition Commission, and for three decades was a Professor of Economics at the University of the Philippines. He has authored and co-edited seven books and published nearly 100 academic papers and chapters covering wide areas of economic development, including poverty, inequality, human development, agricultural and rural development, and political economy of policy reforms in the Philippines and East Asia. Secretary Balisacan has previously been

President of the Philippine Economic Society and is a lifetime member of the National Academy of Science and Technology.

Muhamad Chatib Basri

Former Minister of Finance of Indonesia



He was a former Minister of Finance of Indonesia as well as former Chairman of the Indonesian Investment Coordinating Board. He currently serves as the Co-Chair of the Pandemic Fund (Financial Intermediary Fund for Pandemic Prevention, Preparedness, and Response) hosted by the World Bank with technical support from WHO. He was also a member of numerous International Advisory councils including the World Bank Advisory Council on Gender and Development, the Independent High-Level Expert Group on Climate Finance for COP27 and 28, and the Advisory Board, Centre

for Applied Macroeconomic Analysis, the Australian National University. Dr. Basri teaches at the Department of Economics University of Indonesia. He also holds a position on the Governing Board of the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy at the National University of Singapore. His expertise is International Trade, Macroeconomics and Political Economy. He is the author of a number of papers in international journals and actively writes for various leading newspaper and magazines in Indonesia

Sakon Varanyuwatana

The Chair of the Office of the University Council at Thammasat University

Sakon Varanyuwatana is currently serving as the Chair of the Office of the University Council at Thammasat University. Before his role as the Chair of the Office of the University Council, he held several prominent roles, including Deputy Dean for Planning and Development



(2006–2014) and Dean (2014) of the Faculty of Economics at Thammasat University, along with serving as a member of the National Strategic Planning Committee for Public Administration Reform under the National Economic and Social Development Council. Additionally, he was a member of the Ethics Committee for the Thai Customs Department and the University Council of Thammasat University. He was appointed as a board member of the Trade Competition Commission and then became president of the Trade Competition Commission. His area of expertise is Public

Economics. He is the author of a book chapter and various paper including Property tax in Thailand (2004) book chapter of the International Handbook of Land and Property Taxation and his recent paper is Fiscal Decentralization and intergovernmental transfer in Thailand (2017)
